Foreman: All Foremen shall be paid no less than two dollars (\$2.00) per hour more than the hourly wage rate of the highest classification over which they have leadership. In the event the Contractor, at his option, elects to use a Foreman to supervise other Foremen (**General Foremen**), he shall be paid not less than **two dollars (\$2.00)** per hour more than the hourly rate of the highest classified Foreman over whom he has leadership.

APPRENTICE WAGE RATES AND FRINGE BENEFITS

Apprentices shall be paid not less than the following percentages of the current Group IV Journeyman rate which is \$46.11 per hour effective July 1, 2024.
